10:15	Splendors and Miseries of Creative Teaching and Learning (Creativity as the last Chance in the Perspective of Development of Principles of Education) LIUTAURAS DEGĖSYS <i>is a professor of philosophy at Vytautas Magnus University. His research areas are Philosophy of Art, Social Philosophy, Philosophy of Education, Philosophy for Children. He is a member of the Lithuanian Writers Union, also a member of Lithuanian PEN.</i> <i>L.Degėsys has got the Lithuanian Republic Government Culture and Art Award (2013) for poetry and Twice - Awards of Ministry of Culture (2010, 2017) for the essays and non-fiction writing.</i> <i>L.Degėsys has published eight books of poetry, four collections of philosophical essays and three novels. He is also the author of more than ten textbooks and manuals for the secondary school and high education.</i>

Sabolius has been a lecturer and host at The School of Creativity, an interactive platform for schoolchildren that is designed to foster creative takes on traditional school curricula. It aims to introduce narrativity, playfulness and imagination in order to transcend the boundaries of disciplines and foster a more engaging interaction with traditional school subjects. How not to be afraid to express what you feel and listen to the feelings of the other."</p> <p>ANDRIUS ŽEBRAUSKAS</p> <p><i>A well-known actor, lecturer and coach. He is the first teacher of theatrical improvisation in Lithuania. In 2009 he founded the improvisation theater "Kitas kampas", which has existed until then.</i></p> <p><i>Andrius For two years carried out the project “Improvisation model: development of communication, self-expression and creative skills of school community members”, which was recognized as the "Best Project".</i></p> <p><i>Through improvisation, students, teachers, and parents found a way to authentic and spontaneous communication that allowed them to be without social roles and statuses. Their relationship became closer and warmer. More confidence has emerged.</i></p>

15:40	<p>WORKSHOP 1 first round (ANDRIUS ŽEBRAUSKAS)</p> <p>“Godopoco - We learn to express and listen to feedback"</p> <p>Workshop using method of theatrical improvisation</p> <p>Godopoco is a role-playing game that simulates challenging situations.</p> <p>Godopoco is a method for developing communication skills and emotional intelligence.</p> <p>In this game there are roles like father and child. An improvised conversation takes place in the chosen situation. When emotions arise, the interaction is stopped and feedback is given immediately - in a disciplined and structured manner.</p> <p>We learn to express our feedback and listen to partner feedback.</p> <p>By participating in various roles, the participant has a better understanding of his or her and the child's behavior. Seeing restrictive tactics of one’s behavior creates a motivation to change them. The conversation is improvised. There is a lot of freedom here for creativity and experimentation.</p>	
15:25	<p>WORKSHOP 2 first round (DONATAS NOREIKA)</p> <p>Can creativity help in everyday parental situations?</p> <p><i>In the workshop we will look for solutions for real life parental problems, applying various creativity methods and positive experiences from other parents.</i></p> <p>We, parents, all had or have situations, where we feel stuck... On the other hand, we all had cases, when we weaved seemingly hard circumstances into a piece of art... And third, there is a field of applied creativity, which advertises itself as offering tools for those who feel stuck... In the workshop, we will play to put these three together: we will look for solutions for real life parental problems, applying various creativity methods and positive experiences from other parents.</p> <p>DONATAS NOREIKA</p> <p><i>Donatas Noreika, PhD, has main training in clinical psychology and works as a psychotherapist and a lecturer. After tasting fields as diverse as academic psychology, existential therapy, dance and movement therapy, experiential learning, music and sports, now he is especially interested in integrating these fields in exploring ways of living in an authentic way in everyday situations.</i></p>
